1	<b>Western Wake Regional Water Reclamation Facility</b>	\$1 million	Interior and Environment / EPA's State and Tribal Assistance Grant Program	Funding will be used for design and permitting for a new regional wastewater treatment facility to serve Cary, Apex, Morrisville, Holly Springs and RTP.
2	<b>Western Wake Regional Water Reclamation Facility</b>	\$1 million	Energy and Water Development / Army Corps of Engineers General Construction	Funding will be used for design and permitting for a new regional wastewater treatment facility to serve Cary, Apex, Morrisville, Holly Springs, and RTP.
3	<b>Walker Street Grade Separation</b>	\$1 million	Transportation, HUD, and Related Agencies FHWA's TCSP Program	Funding will be used for preliminary design and engineering, and to conduct a grade separation feasibility study, where Walker Street crosses rail tracks shared by CSX, Norfolk Southern, and Amtrak.
4	<b>Cary Police Department's Technology Improvements</b>	\$300,000	Commerce, Justice, Science DOJ's COPS Law Enforcement Technology	Funding will be used to purchase remaining in-car cameras and to install wireless hot spots at key intersections throughout the town.
5	<b>Historic Preservation Efforts to the Old Cary Elementary School</b>	\$300,000	Interior and the Environment NPS' Save America's Treasures	Funding will be used to renovate the Old Cary Elementary School for use as a visual and performing arts gallery.
6	<b>Town of Cary Watershed Protection and Stream Restoration</b>	\$300,000	Agriculture NRCS's Conservation Operations	Funding will be used to establish protective buffers that will limit agriculture runoff and improve the quality of water in impaired watersheds.
7	<b>West Cary Stream Restoration</b>	\$95,000	Energy and Water Section 206, Aquatic Ecosystem Restoration	Installation of planted and natural riparian buffers to limit runoff and improve the quality of water that flows into Jordan Reservoir.

In addition to these projects, the following non-appropriations and policy items are included in the work plan for The Ferguson Group.

<b>Non-Appropriations / Policy Items</b>	
1.	Actively promote efforts to provide federal support for local government efforts to address global climate change.
2.	<b>Advocate for full federal funding of the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program.</b>
3.	Monitor federal legislation related to low power FM regulations and other potential emergency communications.
4.	Track federal water infrastructure funding legislation and ensure that Town of Cary would be an eligible recipient of any forthcoming funding.
5.	Research planning and assessment funding for water intake facility at Jordan Lake.
6.	Engage in discussions with Department of Energy regarding agency dollars for dryer sludge facilities.
